## THAILAND: Royal Anthem (*Phlaysong Sansoen Phra Barami*)

The Kingdom of Thailand is bordered by Laos, Myanmar, Cambodia and Malaysia. Bangkok, the Thai capital, is the country's centre of political, commercial, industrial and cultural activities. Thailand is roughly the size of Spain, with a population of about 63 million. Thailand is a constitutional monarchy with His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej, the ninth king of the House of Chakri, as the ruling monarch. The King has reigned for more than half a century and is the longest reigning Thai monarch as well as the longest reigning monarch in the world.

Thailand is one of the few monarchies (like Denmark and Sweden) that have a Royal Anthem for the royal family, as well as a National Anthem for the people. The National Anthem, broadcast every day at 8am and 6pm, is a jaunty march-tune, in contrast to the dignified music of the Royal Anthem. The lyrics of the Royal Anthem were written around 1913 by Prince Narisara Nuvadtivongs (1863-1947) and were later revised by King Rama VI. The music was composed in the 1890s by the Russian composer and conductor, Pyotr Schurovsky who studied at the Moscow Conservatory with Tchaikovsky and later with Moscheles and Litoff. Schurovsky frequently conducted at the Bolshoi Theatre. He published a collection of 85 national anthems and his compositions include an opera, piano pieces, and nearly 30 songs.

The Thai Royal Anthem is performed at state occasions and public meetings, and is played at the start of plays, musicals, concerts, and most other live performances of music or theatre. The anthem is most often heard in the cinemas, where it precedes the main feature. Several slightly different arrangements of the anthem are in regular use. When the anthem is played, the audience stands in respectful silence.
